

Hello, fellow BCBC members and riders! Happy Easter, everyone, as the working folk enjoy a three-day weekend!


Let's just hope the weather cooperates. March Madness is

April 27: CW28 Tour of Fredericksburg 8am Start from Conrad Weiser East Elementary

#### ♦ 57 miles, 2,618 ft of climbing

From the ride start in Wernersville the route finds many short but steep hills on the way out towards Mt. Aetna. Then the route flattens a bit as it continues west to Fredericksburg. There is a planned stop at mile 27. After the stop the route stays in Lebanon county south of Myerstown through familiar places like Richland and Newmanstown but with a few different roads. It's the normal east-bound ride back through Robesonia to the finish.

May 25: CWW04 To the Susquehanna and Back • 8 AM Start from Conrad Weiser West

- Elementary Womelsdorf
- 100 miles, 4,000 ft. of climbing

Join in on one of the flattest century routes in the clubs library. This ride heads west staying to the south side of Lebanon on the way to the first control in Annville at mile 25. From Annville the ride turns more to the south going through Campbelltown on the way to Bainbridge which sits along the Susquehanna River.

We will join the Northwest River trail on our way to Marietta and the second stop at mile 55. The river trail is a paved trail that follows the Susquehanna River into Columbia. From Columbia we ride through western Lancaster County on our way to Lititz and the final stop at mile 77.

### **BERKS COUNTY BICYCLE CLUB RIDES**

First Number: Terrain Rating Terrain rating 1-5 rates the total hilliness of the ride. 1 = FLAT–easiest

**2= GENTLY ROLLING HILLS**—moderate terrain with easiest of hills (Almost anyone can handle).

**3= SOME HILLS–***Moderate hills with* some steeper grades (Moderately Challenging–but within the ability of most riders).

**4= HILLY–**The number and difficulty of hills is quite substantial (Very Challenging).

**5= EXTREMELY HILLY–***Extreme Challenge- steep and long hills most of the ride.* 

Requires a very high fitness level).

Second Number: Total Mileage for ride Please note the Club policy on protective headgear: ALL Riders must wear Snell/ANSI rated helmets. Ride Host/ Hostess will NOT give cue sheets to riders without helmets and that rider will not be considered an official participant of the Club ride.

Please have your bike in proper working order BEFORE the start of ride. Arrive 10-15 minutes before start time so that all rides leave on time. Bring a spare tube or patch kit, and at least one water bottle. If weather conditions are questionable, the ride host may notify club members by posting a message on **Facebook** prior to the ride or make a decision at the starting location based on road conditions and the weather forecast.

### **Berks County Bicycle Club Meeting Minutes** March 18, 2024, via Zoom

Attendees: Linda Gross, Alan Fineman, Kathleen Casner, Walt Hug, Jane Brown, Felix (Poncho) Peña.

(Editor's note: Owing to technical difficulties detailed notes were not kept, but the following represents an encapsulated version of the discussion. No decisions requiring a vote were made.)


Membership: Kathleen C., who has been organizing the banquet, reported that everything is set up for it and 45 people had signed up. She expected no more than 50 to attend. Attendees concurred that 50 would be the number of reservations, as the next day was the deadline for submitting the information to Ozgood's.

Kathleen also put together a gift basket for the raffle.

Finance: Alan reported nothing significant has changed in BCBC finances. The insurance bill has been paid.

Alan is looking into sites for the picnic and will be in touch with the executive committee via email about options so they can make a decision.

Bylaws: Alan and Poncho P. will



continue work on a final copy of the bylaws revision for the executive committee to vote on at the April meeting. This way it can be published in the May issue of the newsletter so that the general membership can vote on it at the picnic, which is a general membership meeting, in June.

In the discussion, it was stressed that only four positions would be voted on: president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary. Other, appointed positions, now generally referred to as committees, would be formally known as coordinators-e.g. Shoo-Fly coordinator, newsletter coordinator, public relations/media liaison coordinator (currently advocacy and trails liaison), etc.

The four elected officials and coordinators would constitute the executive committee.

The attendees discussed the possibility of adding a vote-by-mail option for the general meetings as part of the bylaws amendment. Ultimately it was decided that such votes would be cast via the United States Postal Service, by regular mail, with the votes due before the date of the general membership meeting, and require a signature in order to be included in the official tally. This will be incorporated into the bylaws amendments.

(Editor's note: None of these changes will apply until they have been approved by the general membership, subsequent to approval by the executive committee.)

Note: Our current bylaws, specifically Article XIII, dictate that any changes must be approved by the membership at a general meeting, Why? The bylaws lack precision in and at least 10% of the membership must be present in order to vote on it. Also the notice of the changes must be published beforehand in the newsletter.

What are some of the changes being proposed for the bylaws?

1. Give standing committee chairpeople a vote on board decisions affecting their committee if they are not board members.

Change the status of most current standing committee chairpeople to coordinators.

3. Eliminate the Racing Division and change the Advocacy and Trail

Liaison position to Media Liaison (The last is Walt H.'s idea. He is the current A&T Liaison.)

4. Change from Robert's Rules of Order to Modern Rules of Order, 5th edition. This is a widely used and preferred set of rules among nonprofit groups.

5. Rewording needed in a number of places, for clarity's sake.

6. Specify that online meetings will be considered official and proper.

7. Will voting by email or phone be allowed? In what circumstances?

8. Other matters, as required.
